# **OET**

The OET assesses the English language proficiency of healthcare professionals who seek to practice in an English-speaking environment. It focuses on the language skills necessary for effective communication in healthcare settings.

# **NCLEX**

The NCLEX is the standardised exam for nursing licensure in Australia. It tests the knowledge, skills, and abilities essential for safe and effective practice as a nurse and a prerequistic for APHRA for a nursing role in Australia.

# **OSCE**

The OSCE is a practical exam for healthcare professionals to assess their clinical skills in a controlled environment. It is often required for licensing and certification in various countries.

# Foreign Worker Protections in Australia

Australia's Fair Work Commission (FWC) ensures a level playing field for both local and foreign workers. This means that regardless of your visa status, you're entitled to the same basic protections and benefits as any Australian employee.

**Equal Treatment:** Workplace laws in Australia apply to all workers employed in the country. This includes minimum pay rates, working hours, leave entitlements, and termination procedures. There's no distinction between foreign and local workers under the Fair Work Act.
